FOUNDING


The US-China Transpacific Foundation (UCTPF) was established in 2015 to forge strong bilateral ties between the two nations with the belief that a positive relationship between the world's two most influential economies is essential for the well-being of the global peace and economy.

The US-China Transpacific Foundation is a non-profit public organization and is classified by the IRS as a tax-exempt 501(c)(3) organization with MECEA status to allow the Foundation to carry out programs that comply with the requirements of Section 108A of the Mutual Educational and Cultural Exchange Act of 1961 [Public Law 87-256] and implement regulations set forth in 22 CFR Part 64.

MISSION

The Foundation strives to promote the mutual interests of both the United States and China through political, cultural and educational exchanges as well as economic and trade forums designed to promote productive partnerships between businesses from the two nations. In essence, the aim of the Foundation is to raise public and corporate awareness of the importance of the US-China relationship, increase communication across many sectors, and foster closer relationships between the US and China.

ADDRESS FROM THE CHAIRMAN AND THE PRESIDENT





Year 2019 marked the 40th anniversary of US-China diplomatic relations, which is an opportunity for the two nations to work together to shape a promising future. Over the past four decades, the bilateral relations have made historic progress despite twists and turns, delivering tremendous benefits to their peoples and contributing significantly to world peace and prosperity. However, US and China have also encountered an unprecedented complex situation, with raising tensions in areas such as economy & trade, technology, people-to-people exchange and ideology.

The Foundation organized its first US-China Track II High-level Exchange – the US-China Eminent Persons Forum in 2019. The US delegation was co-chaired by Sen. Joseph Lieberman, former senior US Senator (Connecticut-D) and Chairman of the Senate Committee on Homeland Security and Governmental Affairs, and Amb. Sigmund Rogich, Chairman of UCTPF, Senior Assistant to President George H.W. Bush. The forum was held in Diaoyutai, the State Guest House in Beijing. The delegation met with Mr. Wang Qishan, Vice President of PRC and with Mr. Yang Jiechi, Member of the Political Bureau of the CPC Central Committee and Director of the Office of the Foreign Affairs Commission of the CPC Central Committee in Zhongnanhai, Beijing separately. In 2020, with the on-going Covid-19 pandemic, the Foundation organized the 2nd Track II High-level Exchange online. Dr. Henry Kissinger and Mr. Yang Jiechi gave the opening addresses respectively, demonstrating the significance of the forum to the ongoing US-China relationship.

The Foundation continued to organize US Congressional Staff Delegation to visit China in 2019 with Chinese People's Institute of Foreign Affairs (CPIFA). In 2019, the Foundation continued to focus visits around developing an understanding of China's reform and opening-up policy. During their stay in China, Congressional delegates visited a number of government bodies, institutions and cultural sites, where they carried out in-depth exchanges on Reform and Opening-up Policy, US-China relations, international and regional issues of common concern with their Chinese counterparts. The bipartisan US Congressional staff that participated came from the Committee on Energy and Natural Resources, House Budget Committee, Senate Committee on Armed Services, etc.

Undeniably, 2020 will be marked as an unusual moment in history for humanity. The COVID-19 pandemic has accelerated significant changes unseen in a century. The global economy found itself tremendously challenged by a literal standstill situation. Industrial and supply chains were substantially disrupted, escalating risks and uncertainties to the world

economy never seen before. It is precisely this reason that the world needs to come together at this critical juncture, especially the two largest economies in the world, working together. Both the United States and China play critical roles in revitalizing the world's economy. UCTPF will continue to work hard to provide a constructive platform to engage both nations for better understanding and appreciation of each other's similarities and differences and to get back on the right track.

Looking forward, the Foundation is seeking to develop additional avenues for more mutual exchanges, both on-line and in person. We will continue the US-China Track II High-level Exchange, organize more themed delegation visits, as well as activities that promote communication between America and China.

The Foundation has formed a sub-committee on US-China High-level Exchange, which is co-chaired by Amb. Sigmund Rogich, Chairman of UCTPF, Senior Assistant to President George H.W. Bush, and Sen. Joseph Lieberman, former senior US Senator (Connecticut-D) and Chairman of the Senate Committee on Homeland Security and Governmental Affairs. The committee consists of a group of active US bipartisan leaders, who have served in a variety of capacities including the US Congress, judicial positions, and high-level US military generals, etc.

The US-China Transpacific Foundation is most grateful to all the support and help it has received from both government and commercial sectors, and to those who have contributed to the success of our programs. We would like to especially mention our sincere appreciation to Ambassador Cui Tiankai and CPIFA for the strong support of the Foundation. With continuous backing from all parties, we strongly believe that the Foundation will be able to achieve more, and that our efforts will make evident and meaningful contributions to the strengthening of US-China relations, which in turn will benefit the peace, progress and prosperity of both nations and the world.



POLITICS AND POLICY PROGRAMS

UCTPF assists policy-makers in organizing exchange activities to encourage dialogue and cooperation on issues of importance to relations of both nations. Our Foundation helps promote bilateral exchanges and high-level discussion between governments to open communication channels and develop a better understanding of government policy.

MEETING WITH MR. WANG QISHAN, VICE-PRESIDENT OF PRC



Mr. Wang Qishan, Vice-President of PRC, met with US-China Track Two High-level Exchange US delegation, which was led jointly by Mr. Joseph Lieberman, former senior US Senator and Amb. Sigmund Rogich, Chairman of UCTPF, at Zhongnanhai Ziguangge on September 16th, 2019.

Mr. Wang Qishan and the US delegation had an open exchange on the problems both countries are facing and the different ways to deepen mutual interests, to improve US-China relations. Mr. Wang reckoned that the differences between both nations stem from each's historical development in political, culture and value system. Hence, he could not stress enough the need for both nations to try to understand each other's history.



Both Mr. Wang Qishan and the US Track II delegation reciprocated that non-official exchanges enable more candid and open discussion. Mr. Wang was pleased to point out that "Track II High-level diplomacy" is a special kind of non-official diplomacy, which can promote friendly exchanges between both countries and strengthen mutual trust. He had high expectations for this High-level Track II exchange and expected UCTPF and CPIFA to continue to facilitate events and exchanges on a long-term basis, to promote the development of US-China relations.



MEETING WITH MR. YANG JIECHI, MEMBER OF THE POLITICAL BUREAU OF CPC CENTRAL COMMITTEE



Mr. Yang Jiechi, Member of the Political Bureau of the CPC Central Committee and Director of the Office of the Foreign Affairs Commission of CPC Central Committee met with US-China Track Two High-level Exchange US delegation, led jointly by Mr. Joseph Lieberman, former senior US Senator and Amb. Sigmund Rogich, Chairman of UCTPF, at Zhongnanhai on September 18th, 2019.

Mr. Yang and the US Track II delegation exchanged views on establishing US-China mutual trust and promoting US-China bilateral relations. Both agreed that the United States and China should abandon confrontation and conflict, evade strategic misjudgment to achieve win-win cooperation. Mr. Yang also believed the result of this High-level Track II exchange could be brought back to US to play a positive role in leading future cooperation between the two nations in various fields. This will enable US-China to build and enhance mutual trust and to promote all-rounded development of friendly relations between the two nations.

US-CHINA EMINENT PERSONS FORUM

"US-China Track Two High Level Exchange --US-China Eminent Persons Forum" was cohosted by the US-China Transpacific Foundation (UCTPF) and the Chinese People's Institute of Foreign Affairs (CPIFA) at the Diaoyutai State Guesthouse in Beijing from September 16th to 18th, 2019.

The Chinese Delegation was headed by Mr. Wang Chao, President of CPIFA with members including Mr. Zhao Qizheng, former Chairman of the Foreign Affairs Committee of the Chinese People's Political Consultative Conference and Minister of the Information Office of the State Council, Amb. Zhou Wenzhong, former Chinese Ambassador to the US and former Chinese Vice Foreign Minister, Mr. Li Junru, former Vice President of the Central Party School of the Communist Party of China, Mr. Long Yongtu, former Vice Minister of the Ministry of Foreign Trade and Economic Cooperation and Chief Negotiator for China's WTO Accession, Gen. Forum Chen Xidogong, former Deputy Commander of a change Air Force of the Chinese People's Liberation Army, Mr. Zhou Mingwei, former Director of China Foreign Languages Publishing Administration and Vice Minister of the Taiwan Affairs Office of the State Council, Dr. Zhu Min, Chairman of the National Institute of Financial Research of Tsinghua University, former Deputy Managing Director of the International Monetary Fund and Vice Governor of the People's Bank of China, Gen. Yao Yunzhu, former Director of the Center for China-America Defense Relations of the Academy of Military Science and Amb. Zhao Weiping, Vice President of CPIFA.

Both sides affirmed that communication is of great necessity to a good bilateral relationship and were prepared for a continual exchanges.

The US Delegation was headed by Mr. Joseph Lieberman, former senior US Senator from Connecticut, with members including Amb. Sigmund Rogich, former senior assistant to US President and Chairman of UCTPF, Amb. Bill Richardson, former Governor of New Mexico, US Secretary



2020 TRACK TWO HIGH-LEVEL EXCHANGE

The Second Meeting of the US-China Track II High-level Exchange -- US-China Eminent Persons Forum, co-hosted by the US-China Transpacific Foundation (UCTPF) and Chinese People's Institute of Foreign Affairs (CPIFA), was successfully held online from 8th to 9th December, 2020. Mr. Yang Jiechi, member of the Political Bureau of the CPC Central Committee and Director of the Office of the Central Commission for Foreign Affairs delivered a video speech. Dr. Henry Kissinger, former US Secretary of State, attended the meeting and shared his views on US-China relations.

The meeting was co-chaired by Mr. Wang Chao, President of the CPIFA, Amb. Sigmund Rogich, Chairman of UCTPF and Sen. Joseph Lieberman, Former senior US Senator (Connecticut-D) and Co-chair of US-China Track II High-level Exchange. The two sides had in-depth discussions on US-China political, economic and trade relations.



Dr. Kissinger pointed out in his opening remarks that he was honored to officially represent the US in meetings with Chinese leaders 50 years ago. Many dramatic events have taken place in the past 50 years, however, most of the changes were collaborative between the US and China. He mentioned there have been confrontations, mainly economic in recent years, however, he believed that US-China cooperation is of vital importance, not only to world peace, but also to the progress of the

iinternational system. He also believed that US and China can cooperate on common purpose, regardless of the conflicts. He hoped that the two nations find a way to work and live together as well as reaching a constructive solution on common objectives, and to approach the differences with good will. He also expected the new US administration will begin comprehensive dialogues with Chinese leaders and Chinese groups.

US-CHINA EMINENT PERSONS FORUM

Mr. Yang Jiechi believed the Track II forum held by CPIFA and UCTPF is extremely meaningful and conducted in a timely manner. Mr. Yang emphasized that healthy and stable developments of China-US relations not only serves the fundamental interests of the people in both countries, but also meets the common expectation of the international community. He pointed out that cooperation is the best way for the two nations, hoping that the two sides should manage differences in a pragmatic manner and focus on cooperation, so as to bring Sino-US relations back on track.

CONGRESSIONAL STAFF DELEGATIONS 19/20

During the year of 2019-2020, UCTPF hosted more than 30 US congressional staff members, and organized three delegation visits to south, southeast and northeast China, which brought them to Beijing, Haikou, Qionghai, Shenyang, Dalian, Shenzhen and Foshan.

Besides the visits to government bodies and main cultural attractions, they also had the chance to view Li & Miao Minorities Cultural Heritage Park in Qionghai, tour the Shenyang Palace Museum and watch Lion Dance Performance at Foshan Ancestral Temple.



REFORM & OPENING-UP THEMED DELEGATION

Year 2019 marked the 70th anniversary of the founding of the People's Republic of China. It also marked the first year after 40 years of implementation of the reform and opening-up policy.

The 40 years witnessed the rapid development of China's economy, the prompt improvement of its comprehensive national strength and the significant improvement of the living standards of Chinese people. This led to the conception of a "reform and opening up" theme for US Congressional Staff Delegation to China by UCTPF in October 2019. The aim was to fully appreciate China's reform and opening up policy; in doing so, to eliminate misunderstandings, bridge differences, and promote a healthy and stable development of US-China economic and trade relations.

The US Congressional Staff Delegation visited a number of government bodies, institutions and cultural sites during their stay in Guangdong Province. These included meeting with Zhong Jiajun, Deputy Director of the Shenzhen Foreign Affairs Office, going to Shenzhen Stock Exchange, visiting Shenzhen Museum of Contemporary Art to see the exhibition of the 40th Anniversary of Reform and Opening-up in Guangdong Province, and having seminar with experts and scholars from China (Shenzhen) Development Institute (CDI), meeting with Ms. Liu Shan, Deputy Director of the Standing Committee of Foshan Municipal People's Congress. The delegation also visited corporations BYD and Huawei, to name a few.

The delegates gained an in-depth understanding of what Shenzhen had achieved and experienced in the past 40 years of reform and opening-up during their five days long exchange. The delegates marveled at the earth-shaking changes in Shenzhen and believed they have gained valuable insights.


